Glide through groves of tufa spires, paddle through plumes of brine shrimp, and float amongst fascinating birds. On Saturday June 26th and Sunday June 27th, Mono Lake Committee naturalists will lead free canoe tours on Mono Lake to Eastern Sierra locals. Tours depart at 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 a.m, and reservations are required.

Regular public canoe tours will begin on the weekend of July 3rd and 4th and continue through mid-September. Special tours may be made for 12 or more people on weekdays with advance notice.
